## Yellowstone Trail in Washington County

Long-distance auto routes were called “trails” in 1915 when Washington County first saw the transcontinental Yellowstone Trail which ran 3600 miles from Plymouth Rock to Puget Sound. The historic route created by the Yellowstone Trail Association ran through 13 states, 27 miles through Washington County on present WI 175. Counties built the roads, mostly dirt and gravel, with no state or federal aid, but often with local volunteers like C. Fraser, A Maurer, and A. Stark of Washington County.
